WILLIAMSBURG'S NEW NEIGHBORHOOD LANDSCAPE GRANT PROGRAM SUBMITTED BY SALLY SISSELL

The Williamsburg Beautification Advisory Committee (WBAC) has established a program which will offer yearly grants of funds to qualifying neighborhoods within the City of Williamsburg for landscaping work in the common areas of a given neighborhood.

These grants are similar to those the Master Gardeners

have given in the past, from their reserves, to the Neighborhood Connection for disbursement. In fact, last year, two neighborhoods in the City were recipients, which is where the WBAC got the idea (and they thank us for it).

The applications are due to the WBAC by February 15, 2009 and awards announced March 31, 2009. Just remember these grants will be given to Williamsburg neighborhoods only—not throughout JCC.
